

Happy Mother's Day! Today is a blessed opportunity for us to celebrate the gift of our mothers,

grandmothers. and Church mothers! We are blessed with the gift of so many women at St. Moses the Black Parish who nurture, support, and love us. All throughout this Easter season we have been focused on how to live as an Easter people. As believers in the power of resurrection and the promise of new life offered by God, it seems most fitting that our Mother's Dav celebration falls within the Easter season.

On January 7, 2015,

Pope Francis offered his General Audience, during which he shared a catechesis on the family, specifically reflecting on the gift of mothers. He said:

"A society without mothers would be a dehumanized society, for mothers are always, worst in the even moments, witnesses of tenderness, dedication strength. moral Mothers often pass on the deepest sense of religious practice: in a human being's life, the faith value of inscribed in the first prayers, the first acts of devotion that a child learns. It is a message that believing mothers are able to pass on without much explanation: these come later, but the seed of faith is those early precious moments. Without mothers, not only would there be no new faithful, but the faith would lose a good part of its simple and profound warmth. And the Church is mother. with all of this, she is our

mother! We are not orphans. we have a mother! Our Ladv. mother Church, is our mom. We not are orphans, we are children of the Church, we are children of Our Ladv. and we are children of our mothers.

Dearest mothers, thank you, thank you for what you are in your family and for what you give to the Church and the world. And to you, beloved Church, thank you, thank you for being mother. And to you, Mary, Mother of God, thank you for letting us see Jesus. And thank vou for all the mammas present here: let us salute them with а round of applause!"

I echo the words of Pope Francis on this Mother's Day: to all our moms, THANK YOU!

6. THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Acts of the Apostle 1:1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

When they had gathered together they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He answered them, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven."
